Important Notices/Reminders for Schools

We are very nearly at the end of a mammoth term, and we are delighted with the support that training and safeguarding have been given since September.

We have seen all Best Practice Groups and nearly all staff have received training about Rosenshine's Principles of Instruction.

We are very much looking forward to our training that is being delivered on January 5th, 2024, which covers a host of areas. As the 'Developing Writing' training is scheduled for the whole day, lunch will be provided at Cliffe Woods.

EYFS teachers will be attending the Developing Writing across the curriculum training at **Cliffe Woods** and **EYFS leaders** will be attending the EYFS training that is being held at **Stone St Mary.**

EYFS and SEND training

On **January 30th** there will be **Early Excellence Training** around early intervention for children with language and communication difficulties. Communication and language is at the heart of early years practice, ensuring that children have access to the wider world as they grow and develop. To support children who may need more targeted intervention for communication and language, we firstly need to consider the benefits of utilising the opportunities for targeting talk within the provision. This workshop will explore how to create the optimum conditions for talk across your provision, maximising upon the spaces and resources you provide and considering how as adults we can tune into children's interests in order to provide effective interventions within the provision.

Delegates will leave with ways to successfully improve their practice around the delivery of early intervention strategies and develop practical ways to target talk within the environment.

Benefits:

- Understand how to create a climate for talk across your EYFS provision.
- Consider early intervention strategies to support the development of speech, language, and communication. Explore practical ways to target children's talk in the environment.

The afternoon session will be an opportunity to gain some further Clicker 8 training for EYFS Leads and SENDCOs.

The training is for SENCOs and EYFS teachers and will cost £50 for each school with lunch included.

Induction

They should also confirm that they have read and understand the Safeguarding Policy and KCSIE 2023. Induction will take place for all new staff, whatever their role on **January 18**th at **Saint George's Primary Phase.**

Monitoring and Filtering

Please ensure that DSLs are conducting their weekly checks on a staff and pupil account to ensure that our Filtering systems are working correctly. These checks should be recorded and shared with the IT team. KCSIE and Our Safeguarding Policy state that these checks are conducted by DSLs weekly, and the process is supported the IT team with monthly monitoring.


